The Morrison's, both retired teachers from the Clayton School District, became connected to Joe's Place through their former colleague and former Maplewood Richmond Heights School District (MRHSD) Superintendent Dr. Linda Henke. Geoff and Marilyn were both motivated by the

proposed mission of Joe's Place, which was designed to attack the community issue of at-risk high school-aged boys in need of housing and academic support. One of the areas the Morrison's decided to address at Joe's Place was providing clothes for residents at the beginning of the academic year.

When asked about what inspires them to continue volunteering with Joe's Place, Geoff said, "The thing about Joe's Place that is really wonderful is that here you have a school district in a leadership position, reaching out to the community, beyond just the parents and the students in the school, but to all the people in the community and they're saying 'we've got a community problem and we need to deal with it as a community." Marilyn and Geoff see their continued commitment to Joe's Place as a way to not just give back, but to also spread good will and acts of kindness.

One of Geoff and Marilyn's fondest memories occurred on a shopping trip with Joe's Place residents. Marilyn said, "A friend was with us and one of the boys said to her, 'You know I really feel guilty about taking this.' She said to him, 'Tell you what, you do this for somebody sometime in your life and that'll be fine.' He smiled and said 'I'll do it.'" For the Morrison's, the idea that, as Geoff said, "one positive act stimulates others" is one of their primary motivators.

Through their personal involvement with Joe's Place, Geoff and Marilyn Morrison have been integral not only to the success of its mission, but they have also succeeded in encouraging others in their lives to find diverse ways to reach out, take charge, and make a difference in their own communities.
